We encourage you to submit your initial nomination early (name and nomination letter) and then work on getting letters of support and other documentation before the deadline. Please note the earlier deadline of November 20 this year.

Please see below for descriptions and nomination requirements of the three SNS Awards.

Distinguished Career Award

Description:

This award shall be granted on an annual basis to an SNS professional member in good standing who has provided service as well as made an exemplary contribution to SNS and/or the field of sports neuropsychology over the course of their career. The recipient of this award will be required to provide an address/presentation pertinent to the SNS membership at the annual meeting. All materials, as described below, should be submitted by the colleague/nominator putting forth the nomination.

The Distinguished Career Award nomination application should include:

1. letter of nomination by an SNS member in good standing who is a colleague of the nominee, which includes the nominee's name, degree, title if applicable, address, and contact information including email address and a description of why the nominator believes the nominee should receive this award;
2. two letters of recommendation;
3. a recent vita of the nominee; and
4. any optional materials/information supporting the nomination.

Dissertation Award

Description:

This award shall be granted on an annual basis to an SNS member in good standing (who may be a student member) who is a student in, or an early career graduate of, a psychology doctoral program. The dissertation must have been completed within two years prior to the nomination and the topic must be relevant to sports neuropsychology. Self-nominations are welcome.

The Dissertation Award nomination application should include:

1. the nominee's name, degree, title if applicable, address, contact information including email address; and
2. a copy of the dissertation, all of which must be provided electronically.

Early Career Award

Description:

This award shall be granted on an annual basis to an SNS professional or associate member in good standing who has provided a significant impact through service and/or research in the field of neuropsychology and/or SNS within 10 years of receiving their doctoral degree. All materials, as described below, should be submitted by the nominator.

The Early Career Award nomination application should include:

1. letter of nomination, by an SNS professional member in good standing who is familiar with the nominee's work, which includes the nominee's name, degree, title if applicable, address, and contact information including email address and a description of why the nominator believes the nominee should receive this award;
2. two letters of recommendation;
3. a recent vita of the nominee; and
4. any optional materials/information supporting the nomination.

Nomination Application Deadline for all awards is November 20, 2020.
